### General Rules & Regulations

(A602.1) The Lord Simcoe Series competition is sanctioned as a Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC.

(A602.2) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

(A602.5) Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.

(A602.7) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC- sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC- sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

## Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the National Equestrian Federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their respective agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the care and handling of equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- actively promoting the development of and adherence of to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

## Memberships

1. All Exhibitors AND Owners must have their OEF and EC (bronze level) memberships for horse and rider to compete.
2. Exhibitors and Owners must have their EDAS membership to accrue points to qualify for year-end awards. Exhibitors or Owners that do not have their EDAS membership are NOT entitled to accumulate points for the shows they attend as non EDAS members.
3. A photocopy of your current OEF and EC membership cards must accompany your first entry of the season.

4. Failure to provide proof of memberships will result in no points being allocated to the horse and rider at that show. This rule will be strictly enforced.
5. All trainers/coaches must carry the memberships and Sports license equivalent to the level of competition where they are training/coaching.

## Entries

6. Pre-entries must reach the Show Secretary by the Wednesday preceding each show date by midnight. Entries received after this date and time are considered post-entries with a late fee of \$20.00. All entries are made through [www.myesm.ca](http://www.myesm.ca). Initial registration will require all membership numbers etc... subsequent entries are simple. All online entries are considered pre-entries and exhibitors are responsible for payment.
7. Rider numbers will not be issued without receipt of full payment or a signed open cheque left to cover all charges and fees incurred by the competitor.
8. Hors Concours - Permitted in Jumper Classes only. Entry must be declared at the Horse Show Office.
9. NSF's - A \$50.00 penalty will be charged on all returned cheques and the Exhibitor will not be permitted to show at any future LSS Shows until the account has been settled. Payment of outstanding fees will have to be made by cash or certified cheque. Recurrent offenders will be put on a cash only payment option. Unsettled accounts will be turned over to EC, which will result in suspension from all competitions.
10. Scratches - Entry fees will be refunded on presentation of valid medical or veterinary certificate. Certificate must be received within 2 business days after the show entered. Administrative and medic fees are non-refundable. Competitors scratching from a competition will be charged a scratch fee of \$15 plus the administrative and medic fees. A competitor may change classes or divisions at the show however, once a division or class has started and the competitor elects not to compete scratch and fees will apply.

## Attire

11. Proper riding attire must be worn. At all EC-sanctioned competitions, anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times. Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials), or SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.).
12. Riders must wear their numbers at all times in the schooling or competition rings.

## Classes

13. Number of schoolings per division is limited to one (1) per horse/rider combination, unless circumstances allowed for a re-ride as per the discretion of the judge.

14. Points will be accumulated throughout the season for Exhibitors that choose to participate in the Hunter Derby class. Top 3 horse/rider combinations, will be recognized and awarded at the year end banquet.
15. Protests should be directed to the Show Steward.
16. Horses or riders must compete in at least four (4) shows in their respective divisions, for the 2017 season and be in the top 8 placings, to qualify for the year-end awards. The year-end awards are to 8th place for all divisions and equitation classes.
17. For show purposes, ponies are to be divided as follows: A ponies – over 13.2, not exceeding 14.2 hands. B ponies – over 12.2 not exceeding 13.2 hands. C ponies – 12.2 hands and under. Competitors riding a pony are eligible as follows: Junior A riders may not ride B or C ponies; Junior B riders may A, B or C ponies; Junior C riders may ride A, B or C ponies.

#### Other

18. Farrier Services - All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any bills for farrier services. There will be a Farrier on call and the Show Office can contact him for emergency farrier needs.
19. NO DOGS. Please leave your dogs at home. Owners of any loose dogs will be fined \$100.00.
20. Any mistreatment or abuse of horses will not be tolerated at any Lord Simcoe Series shows. Any person doing so will be asked to leave the show grounds immediately.
21. The show management reserves the right to change or amend the show schedule up to one hour prior to the time of the designated class.
22. Alcohol is not permitted on showgrounds.
23. Members of the Essa & District Agricultural Society and affiliates accept no liability for loss, accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, owners, spectators or employees, or any person or property whatsoever.

The Lord Simcoe Series strictly follows all rules and regulations as described by Equestrian Canada in the Equine Medication Control rules. A description of permitted medications is included in these rules and can be found on the Equestrian Canada website.

## Limitations and Guidelines

Horses are limited to 2 hunter divisions, and appropriate equitation or medal classes.  
Horses are limited to 2 jumper divisions and the Jumper medal.  
Horses may compete in 1 hunter division, and 1 jumper division, and their appropriate equitation and medal classes.  
Miscellaneous Classes are not included in these limitations. Be sure to check the horse show prize list for those limitations.  
Number of schoolings per division is limited to one (1) per horse/rider combination, unless circumstances allowed for a re-ride as per the discretion of the Judge.  
Please be diligent about getting entries into Show Secretary by the closing date as published in the horse show prize list whenever possible.

The Show Manager reserves the right to cancel any division that does not have at least three entries on closing date.

The Hunter Derby and Hunter Medal will not run without at least 5 entries on closing date.

All trainers/coaches must carry the memberships and Sports license equivalent to the level of competition where they are training/coaching.

Beginner Hunter Division is open to all beginner riders who have NEVER won 3 first place ribbons over fences at an Equine Canada (EC) sanctioned show. These wins are Lifetime

achievements. Winning your way out - If during a competitor's first year of showing in this division, they win 3 first place ribbons over fences, they will be allowed to remain in division to the end of that calendar year. In any subsequent years of competition, they must progress to another division. Riders showing in this division are not eligible to compete in any other divisions over fences.

Competitors may move both up and down in heights between shows, but competitors may not change heights once the division has started.

#### Hack Division

Open to all. Horses and ponies showing in the hack division may be of any breed or combination of breeds. The division shall consist of Road, Show and Pleasure Hack. Additional requirement for the Road Hack class will be the demonstration of a strong trot. Additional requirements for the Show Hack class will be collected and extended gaits. Both Road and Show hack classes may be required to Hand Gallop. Pleasure hack will never be required to Hand Gallop. Martingales, breastplates, boots of any kind and/or bandages are not permitted. Drop and flash nosebands are prohibited. Brow bands shall be leather but not solid white, colored or sequined. Whips are not permitted in any hack class. In the event of a tie, horses shall be shown in hand and judged on conformation. Road Hack to be shown at a reasonably loose rein, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. To be judged on 55% performance, 15% conformation, 20% substance & 10% manners. Show Hack to be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop; collected and extended gaits to be called for; to stand quietly. To be judged on 55% performance, 20% quality, 15% conformation & 10% manners. Pleasure Hack to be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter. Not to gallop. Medium to light contact to be maintained. To be judged on 45% performance, 15% conformation & 40% manners.
