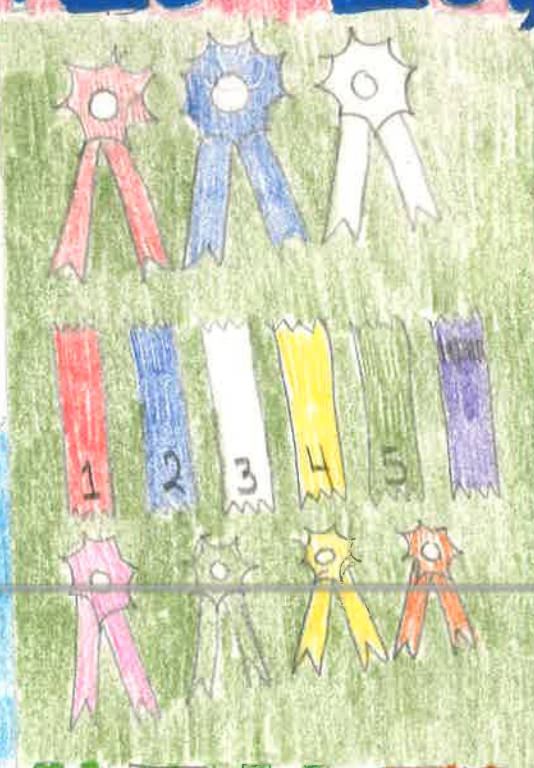

Homecraft Division – General Rules & Regulations

All Departments:

ENTRY DEADLINE: **Friday, August 19, 2022 at 8:00 PM.**

Please Note: With the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the health and safety of the volunteers, exhibitors and staff is our first priority. The Homecraft Committee will follow all the health and safety protocols that are in place by Public Health, and protocols are subject to change at any time.

Rules & Regulations:

1. The closing date for submission of entries on AssistExpo or to the Essa Agriplex Office is no later than **Friday, August 19, 2022 at 8:00 PM** for all general classes in this book. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the preferred method to register and submit your entries is online on AssistExpo.
2. All individual exhibitors must be a member of the Essa & District Agricultural Society (EDAS) when completing the entry forms. There is a \$15.00 membership fee for all Senior Fair exhibitors and a \$5.00 membership fee for all Junior Fair and Special Needs exhibitors. The membership application or number must accompany your signed entry form or your entry form will not be accepted. A new perk of being an adult voting member of the Essa & District Agricultural Society is that it gets you a discount when entering the fairgrounds during the Barrie Fair.
3. There is a new Junior Exhibitor Fee, which is 5% of prize money winnings of \$10.00 and up. There is also a new Senior Exhibitor Fee, which is 10% of prize money winnings of \$10.00 and up. 100% of the Exhibitor Fees collected goes back into the Homecraft Division for next year's Barrie Fair to help with repairs, prize money, supplies, etc.
4. Junior Fair Exhibitors (under the age of 17 as of January 1st) may enter in their own age category only. Where no age is stipulated, that category is open to any child under the age of 17 years as of January 1st. A parent or guardian must sign the Junior Exhibitor's entry form for the Junior Exhibitor.
5. All exhibits must be placed at the Homecraft Division located at the Essa Agriplex on **Tuesday, August 23, 2022** between the hours of **3:00 PM – 8:00 PM**. NO exhibits will be accepted after **8:00 PM**. Please follow the signs located on the grounds to reach Barn 1. From there, the Homecraft Committee will greet you. Health & safety protocols will be followed for everyone's health & safety. The Homecraft Committee will check off the items from your entry list(s) before the exhibitors leave the grounds, and the exhibitors (parents/guardians for the Junior Exhibitors) will sign a consent form agreeing to the General Rules and Regulations, as well as to showcase their winnings with their names on the Essa & District Agricultural Societies Facebook page.
6. **To transfer exhibits to our entry tables safely, please place all your entries in a laundry basket(s) with your name attached to the laundry basket(s). These will be sanitized when you return to pick up your entries on Sunday.**
7. Exhibitors may only make one entry and receive one prize only in each class.

8. Entry tags must be written out and securely attached to the exhibits before arriving at the grounds. Please pick up your entry tags from the Essa Agriplex Office before Tuesday, August 23, 2022, once the entries are completed. The entry tags will be located outside of the Essa Agriplex Office on a table with packages of 15, 25 or 40 entry tags bundled together.
9. Judging will commence Wednesday, August 24, 2022 at 9:00 AM.
10. On **Thursday, August 25, 2022**, there will be Homecraft Awards handed out to the overall winners in the Junior, Senior, and Special Needs Divisions at the Barrie Fair's Opening Ceremony at 6:00 p.m. You will be notified on Thursday morning or afternoon if you have won an award by either the Homecraft Chairperson or a Homecraft Committee Member. Attendance is not mandatory, as your hard work will still be acknowledged to the general public.
11. Exhibits must be picked up on **Sunday, August 28, 2022** between **6:00 PM – 7:30 PM**. There will be no early releases. Any exhibits removed prior to the closing of the Homecraft Division Showcase will forfeit any prizes awarded.
12. Unless otherwise stipulated, all exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and all articles may be shown only twice before being disqualified. Exhibits may not be sold, and no advertisements will be allowed on the exhibits.
13. Additional rules as listed throughout the prize book for each department must be adhered to.
14. Judge(s) decisions are final.
15. The Essa & District Agricultural Society has the right to open all entry tags after judging has been completed.
16. With regards to any discrepancies, the Homecraft Chairperson has the final decision.
17. The Homecraft Chairperson has the right to interpret their own rules and regulations.
18. The Essa and District Agricultural Society is not responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged items.
19. Exhibits not claimed by 8:00 PM on Sunday, August 28, 2022 will become the property of the Essa & District Agricultural Society.
20. Additional rules and regulations listed in this book will also apply.

Junior Fair Division

Department 1 – Agriculture – Vegetables/Fruits

Rules & Regulations

1. This department is for Junior Exhibitors 17 years of age & under. The exhibitor can ONLY enter in the appropriate age category as of January 1st of the current year. (No exceptions).
2. Exhibitors may only enter one item in each appropriate class.
3. All vegetables must be put on appropriately sized disposable plates. Entry tags must be securely fastened prior to dropping off the exhibits.
4. All vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor.
5. For the benefit of the online viewing public, varieties should be named if possible.
6. Judging is based on quality, arrangement, freshness, and cleanliness (all root vegetables must be clean but not scrubbed) free of foreign matter and uniformity (where two or more items are required).
7. The Essa & District Agricultural Society is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.
8. No prize will be awarded to an entry that the judge(s) deems unworthy.
9. The judge(s) decision is final.
10. General Rules also apply.

Prizes: 1st: \$4, 2nd: \$3, 3rd: \$2, 4th: \$1

For Entrants - 10 Years of Age & Under:

- H01. Plant a Bean Seed in a red/blue SOLO cup and bring your grown plant. Cup to be decorated.**
- H02. Carrots – 3 roots, any one variety, same size, 1" tops attached.**
- H03. Cucumber – 1 specimen, any one variety, with stem attached.**
- H04. Tomatoes – 2 specimens, any one variety, ripe or green, with stems attached.**
- H05. Heaviest Zucchini – 1 specimen, with stem attached. Weight to count.**
- H06. Most Unusually Shaped Vegetable – Named.**
- H07. Your Very Best Grown Vegetable – 1 specimen, any one variety, with stem attached.**
Name the vegetable on the top of the entry tag.

For Entrants - 11-17 Years of Age:

- H08. Beans – 5 specimens, any one variety.**
- H09. Carrots – 3 roots, any one variety, same size, 1" tops attached.**
- H10. Cucumber – 1 specimen, any one variety, with stem attached.**
- H11. Tomatoes – 2 specimens, any one variety, ripe or green, with stems attached.**
- H12. Heaviest Zucchini – 1 specimen, with stem attached. Weight to count.**
- H13. Most Unusually Shaped Vegetable – Named.**
- H14. Your Very Best Grown Vegetable – 1 specimen, any one variety, with stem attached.**
Name the vegetable on the top of the entry tag.

Specials - Open to Entrants 17 Years of Age & Under:**H15. Kooky Creature – Made from vegetables only.**

Prizes: 1st: \$6, 2nd: \$4, 3rd: \$2

H16. Garden Salsa – 4 or more homegrown vegetables that would be used to make salsa, suitably arranged.

Prizes: 1st: \$7, 2nd: \$5, 3rd: \$3

H17. Create a Fairy Tale Carriage – Be creative!

Using any combination of vegetables, grains, vines, weeds, flowers, or any other treasures from nature.

Prizes: 1st: \$8, 2nd: \$6, 3rd: \$4

H18. Collection of Vegetables & Fruits – Minimum of 4 varieties, properly named, attractively displayed.

Prizes: 1st: \$10, 2nd: \$6, 3rd: \$4

Department 2 – Culinary Arts**Rules & Regulations**

1. This department is for Junior Exhibitors 17 years of age & under. The exhibitor can ONLY enter in the appropriate age category as of January 1st of the current year. (No exceptions).
2. Exhibitors may only enter one item in each appropriate class.
3. All baked items to be presented on a sturdy, disposable plate of appropriate size with entry tags securely attached to the plate prior to dropping off the exhibits, and placed into a clean, clear and appropriate sized Ziploc type bag unless otherwise directed. Additionally, please attach entry tags to the jar not the lids, and please do not use any twist ties to attach entry tags.
4. The baked goods are judged on general appearance, internal appearance, presentation in general, flavour, and aroma.
5. Baking must be done by the exhibitor, some assistance is accepted.
6. No peanuts or nuts to be used in this section, due to allergies.
7. Please remove any paper wrappings around muffins.
8. Culinary entries will be displayed during the showcase in refrigerated units.
9. The Essa & District Agricultural Society is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.
10. No prize will be awarded to an entry that the judge(s) deems unworthy.
11. The judge(s) decision is final.
12. General Rules also apply.

Prizes: 1st: \$4, 2nd: \$3, 3rd: \$2, 4th: \$1

For Entrants - 10 Years of Age & Under:**H19. Oatmeal Cookies – 3.****H20. Banana Muffins – 3.****H21. Decorate a homemade Rice Krispies Square to be a kite – edible decorations.**

Note: Please do not put in a Ziploc type bag, just place on a plate.

H22. Brownies – 3, iced, without nuts.

Note: Please do not put in a Ziploc type bag, just place on a plate.

H23. One Ice Cream Cone decorated to resemble a Clown Hat – no higher than 8", all edible decorations.

Note: Please do not put in a Ziploc type bag, just place on a plate.

H24. Decorated Marshmallow Snowperson using edible decorations.

Note: Please do not put in a Ziploc type bag, just place on a plate.

For Entrants - 11-17 Years of Age:

H25. No Bake Cookies – 3.

H26. Chocolate Chip Muffins – 3.

H27. Rice Krispies Squares – 3, 2"x2" squares, decorated.

H28. An Old Family Favourite – plate of 3 baked goods, any one variety, nut free, from an old family recipe, named.

H29. Banana Loaf – ½ loaf.

H30. 250 mL jar of Freezer Jam – any variety, name variety.

Specials - Open to Entrants 17 Years of Age & Under:

Prizes: 1st: \$8, 2nd: \$6, 3rd: \$4

H31. Cookies in a Canning Jar – Create a gift canning jar that has the dry ingredients for any nut free variety of cookies.

Decorate the lid, and attach the recipe.

Prizes: 1st: \$7, 2nd: \$5, 3rd: \$3, 4th: \$2, 5th: \$1

H32. A "Three Little Pigs" stick house – made from pretzels. Be creative!

Prizes: 1st: \$7, 2nd: \$5, 3rd: \$3, 4th: \$2, 5th: \$1

H33. Hay Bales made from rectangular sized Rice Krispies displayed with a toy tractor and/or wagon.

Displayed on a piece of cardboard (no larger than 8"x10") covered in aluminum foil. Minimum of 10 Rice Krispies.

H34. Three Cupcakes decorated with Halloween Theme.

Note: Please do not put in a Ziploc type bag, just place on a plate.

H35. Cherry Pie - Pie presented on a foil plate. No size limitations.

Judging based on overall presentation, appearance, taste, etc. Recipe to be attached to the entry tag.

OAAS Junior Baking Special - Open to Entrants 15 Years of Age & Under:

H36. Plain Chocolate Chip Cookie Competition – 6, must consist of plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts.

Displayed on a firm, disposable plate covered in a Ziploc type bag.

Cookies must be no larger than 2.5" (6.5 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm).

Contest is open only to youth up to age 15 years (as of Dec 31 of current year, no exceptions – age to be written on the entry tag).

One class only. The winning entry will move on to the District 5 Competition in the fall.

Please take note of all rules & regulations in the OAAS Section of the Prize Book.

Prizes: 1st: \$10, 2nd: \$6, 3rd: \$4

Department 3 – Domestic Art

Rules & Regulations

1. This department is for Junior Exhibitors 17 years of age & under. The exhibitor can ONLY enter in the appropriate age category as of January 1st of the current year. (No exceptions).
2. Exhibitors may only enter one item in each appropriate class. Entry tags must be securely fastened prior to dropping off the exhibits.
3. Domestic Arts/Crafts MUST be done by the exhibitor.
4. Follow measurements carefully if stated in the description. If entry exceeds maximum measurements, it will be disqualified.
5. Cover artwork in a plastic sleeve when stated in the class description.
6. Fabric, thread and/or yarn samples must be attached to all entries in this department. If applicable.
7. Penmanship entries will be judged on letter formation, spacing, neatness, consistency of letter sizing, and accurate slant suitable for age level. Author's name must be included in penmanship classes or the entry will be disqualified. Print on every other line on a 3-ring piece of lined paper and covered in a plastic sleeve.
8. **PLEASE NO GLUE GUN USE FOR EXHIBITORS UNDER 5 YEARS.**
9. The Essa & District Agricultural Society is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.
10. No prize will be awarded to an entry that the judge deems unworthy.
11. The judge(s) decision is final.
12. General Rules also apply.

For Entrants - 5 Years of Age & Under:

Reminder: Fabric, thread and/or yarn samples must be stapled to entry tags. (If applicable.)

H37. Article made from Popsicle sticks. Be creative!

H38. A creative collection of different stickers mounted on an 8½"x11" piece of construction paper.
Cover with a plastic sleeve.

H39. Painted rock to look like a Farm Animal displayed on a small, sturdy plate.
Please put your initials on the bottom of your rock.

H40. Using a paper bag, create a Farm Animal hand puppet.
Cover with a plastic sleeve.

H41. Create a snowperson using popped popcorn - mount on an 8½"x11" of construction paper.
Cover with a plastic sleeve.

H42. Create a farm animal from an empty toilet paper roll.

H43. COVID Lockdown Project/Craft.

H72. Adult Colouring Book Page – mounted on Bristol board, 1" border around page.

H73. Any Hand Sewn Article.

H74. Soap Making – handmade.

H75. Jewelry – any materials, handmade.

H76. COVID Lockdown Project/Craft.

What new project/craft did you try? Create it. Please name it, and include a brief description with your item(s).

H77. Make a Holiday Decoration (ex. Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, etc.).
